I have enjoyed working with the RIC staff and all the members of the RIC board and I am looking forward to my term as Chair.

I would like to take this opportunity to provide an update on the projects and accomplishments at RIC during the past few months. The Town of Belle Sewer Rehabilitation project is 80% complete, the Morrisvale-Cameo Waterline Extension project in Boone County is 85% complete and the Town of Clay has been awarded a construction contract for the Blue Knob Waterline Extension project. The Manila Ridge Waterline Extension project in Putnam County will be going to bid this fall as well as the Prenter Waterline Extension project in Boone County. RIC has also begun administration of the Grater St. Albans Public Service District Phase III Sewer Project.

The RIC transportation staff continues to work on the Kanawha-Putnam Bike & Pedestrian Plan and is currently in the Public Engagement Stage. RIC has also adopted the West Virginia Department of Transportation's performance targets.

I hope to see you at our quarterly meeting on September 13, 2018 as we work together to promote local communities, regional solutions and statewide impacts.

Fatherly Figures: A Snapshot of Dads Today

Roughly 6 in 10 men are fathers

Of the 121 million men age 15 and over in the United States, about 75 million are fathers to biological, step or adopted children.



54%

of fathers have only adult children who are at least 18 years old



46%

of fathers have at least one minor child who is less than 18 years old



Roughly 1 in 4 men are grandfathers



Of the 35 million fathers of minor children, 1.7 million (roughly 2 percent) are "single" fathers who are living with at least one child under 18 with no spouse or partner present.
